

The AILASA Prize for Best Doctoral Dissertation

The Association of Iberian and Latin American Studies of Australasia (AILASA) is seeking entries for the AILASA Prize for the Best Doctoral Dissertation in the field of Iberian and Latin American Studies produced in an Australian or New Zealand university. The prize of \$250 AUD will be awarded for a doctoral dissertation conferred from late 2022 to 2023.

The judging panel will consist of the President of AILASA, or their representative, and up to three other judges. Only one award will be made per year. AILASA reserves the right to not award a prize in any given year. Other outstanding work may be recognised with an "Honourable Mention."

In order to be eligible for consideration by the judging panel, the following eligibility criteria must be met:

- 1) The doctoral dissertation must be on a topic related to Iberian or Latin American Studies. It may be written in English, Spanish or Portuguese, and must be produced in a New Zealand or Australian University, according to the relevant regulations of the university in question.
- 2) The author must be a current member of AILASA to be eligible to apply.
- 3) The dissertation must be accompanied by the full examiners' reports, without modification or deletion. The University's formal advice on any required changes must also be included.
- 4) Authors who were nominated for or received University medals should make this clear in their electronic submission.
- 5) An electronic copy of the article (PDF or other format) must be submitted to the AILASA secretary by **Tuesday 28 November 2023**. Submission is electronic via ailasa@ailasa.org.

The winning author and their nominee will be informed in late 2023 via email by the President of AILASA. Details of the winning dissertation will be posted on the AILASA website.
